HELP FOR WATER PROJECTS ON THREE CONTINENTS A CLICK AWAY

Imaging walking miles in the heat carrying a heavy water jug, full of water that may not be safe - that is the reality for over one billion people who don't have access to an adequate water supply. Some 2.4 billion lack basic sanitation. Earth Day Network has developed the Global Water Network, a website to raise awareness about water issues and generate sponsorships of water and sanitation projects on three continents through our "Adopt a Water Project." The interactive website has a focus on rural communities facing poor water and sanitation conditions.
